

#539 Ghost Layers & Color Washes


By Katie Pasquini Masopust,

This book presents a three-step technique for adding layers of visual interest to representational quilts.

The steps are: making a design

based on a photograph or a drawing; adding a "ghost" shape that is lighter or darker than the base block colours; and creating a colour wash that allows use of more colours in the quilt.

The blocks are constructed using raw-edge or turnededge appliqué. The book also includes the author's seven-step programme for choosing perfect fabric combinations.



#540 Hobo Quilts: 55+ Original Blocks Based on the Secret Language of Riding the Rails by Debra G. Henninger

More than 55 symbols used by hobos to communicate with each other converted into unique, never-beforeseen quilt blocks.



#542 Celtic Pieced Illusions by Karen Combs


Piecework enthusiasts rejoice! Now great Celtic designs can be created with only two simple blocks.




#543 Puzzle Quilts: Simple Blocks, Complex Fabrics by Paula Nadelstern








#547 French Braid Transformation: 12 Spectacular Strip-Pieced Quilts


