

Guidelines for the Quilt Story

Here is a list of questions you can answer as you prepare your story to accompany your quilt. Please aim for about 130 words (less is ok too!)

How long have you been quilting?

What inspired you to make this quilt? Was it a fabric, or a pattern, or an idea, or the need for a gift, or something else?

Is there something special about where the fabrics for the quilt came from?

Is it for someone or are you keeping it yourself?

When did you make it? How was it quilted and who quilted it?

What size is the quilt?

The story of my quilt – Jan McDonnell

I made this quilt in the winter of 2016 (I tend to make a quilt a year) and had to rush to get it done before the weather warmed up and the gardening season started! I bought the anchor fabric a year ago or so and then found a Border Creek Station pattern that suited the fabric perfectly. It took me a long time to search for fabrics to complete the design as the ability to put colours together doesn't come naturally to me. I quilted it myself using Debbie's long-arm quilting machine at Muskoka Quilts on Manitoba St in Bracebridge.

The quilt is queen-sized and I am keeping it for ourselves, but I haven't decided where it will be used just yet.
