"What Makes it Modern?"



Our presentation with Weeks & Bill is different. You will receive a link to the lecture a week before our meeting. Watch the presentation BEFORE our meeting! One of them will join us at our meeting on Thursday March 14th @ 1:00 pm for a Q & A session. We will also get a sneak peek of what they are currently working on. The lecture link will expire at midnight after the live Q&A.

This lecture discusses how quilting, like other design disciplines such as fashion, industrial design and architecture, has evolved over time. Culture, economics, technology and society have played a part in this evolution as well, especially over the past 50 years. These changes laid the groundwork for new approaches to designing and making quilts. We'll apply this history to new ways to think about planning and making quilts that will inspire you to expand your palette and your skill set.

Coming in January

Embroidery Appliqué with Betty Ann Mc and Susan P.

Date: Thursday January 25, 2024

Time: 1:00 p.m. Cost: \$10.00 Location: Zoom

The purpose of the Embroidery Appliqué Workshop is to give the participants a better understanding and comfort level of using an embroidery machine for appliqué There will be a general discussion of machine embroidery, supplies required, threads, etc. A pattern for appliqué will also be demonstrated.



Participants can choose to appliqué along with Betty Ann and Susan or just sit back and watch and maybe pick-up a few pointers. Questions will be welcome throughout the presentation.

For those who wish to complete the project during



the workshop, the pattern can be purchased from the Juju Embroidery site (designsbyjuju.com). The pattern will create a mug rug and is called Sunflower Mug Rug. The cost of the pattern as of November 2023 was \$5.00 US.

Coming in February

Foundation Paper Piecing with Julie D.

Date: Thursday February 29, 2024

Time: 1:00 p.m. Cost: \$10.00 Location: Zoom

Foundation paper piecing allows the creation of intricate and precise designs. By sewing fabric onto a paper foundation, quilters can achieve accurate shapes and sharp points at irregular angles, making seemingly complex designs achievable. In this workshop, Julie will cover the basics of FPP as an introduction to the technique. However, like so many aspects of quilting there are many ways to do things, so Julie will also explore variations available. Participants will create a Canadian Maple Leaf quilt block (using a free online pattern from Monica Curry Quilt Design) during the workshop.

Labeling and Recording Your Quilts - For Yourself and the Future with Heather I.

Heather has the equivalent of 4 albums filled with write-ups, photos and fabric swatches for all of the hundreds of quilts she has made since 1985. us to track our own work. The presentation will be about an hour with time for a "Q & A" after.

Scraptastic Quilted Cards with David Owen Hastings

Thursday, April 25, 2024 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm Eastern Time Cost \$55.00 Canadian Maximum 30 Participants

Grab a handful of fabric scraps, and let's make some art! Your scrap bin is a great and underused resource! It's often full of beautiful fabrics, but in very small amounts. Sometimes it contains mistakes that we would rather toss into the scrap bin than unpick. It's time to dive in and make something beautiful from those off-cuts and whoopsies. Using just a few pieces of fabric pulled from scraps, we will machine sew a mini series of modern art cards. We'll explore



colour, scale of print, value, and texture... and maybe come up with some surprising combinations!

Gather all the supplies and be ready to work near your computer. A desktop or laptop computer will give you the best experience. A good task light is nice, to help both light you and your work so you can share on camera.

Please do sign in a few minutes early: we will start promptly at **1:00 pm Eastern Time**. Please double-check the start time if you live in a different time zone.
The workshop is 3 hours. We will take a break midway.


Modern Group
