• Quilt Show Planning on Zoom

Here are some steps that I hope will help you out:

- 1. Complete the sentence "Donut you just love toi.e. travel, grandkids, cup of tea with a friend, reading a book, camping, watching a sunset, going to a fair, flower arranging, gardening, something on your bucket list, etc.
- 2. What do you see in your mind? Jot down the parts of the picture you are envisioning. I can hear you saying, "I can't draw!!!!" Neither can I. One of my brothers got all that talent.
- 3. Source out pictures on the internet under clip art, stained glass, patterns, photos that you have, magazines etc. If they need resizing, you can resize them either on your own printer or ask Staples, for example. Printing them in black and white often helps with placement of light, medium and dark tones of fabric
- 4. Sketch out your picture for placement. It can be as simple or as complex as you wish and the completed project is no more than 24"x24"
- 5. Once you have your picture roughed out, go through your stash to choose fabrics. Of course, make sure the gifted "donuts" are in that pile (a) Your donut fabric, when all is said and done, will not likely look like donuts as you are going to cut the fabric into different shapes and sizes. The fun part, when your project is done, is for the rest of us to admire your piece and try to find the donut fabric. You will be surprised at how well you can disguise it while other pieces can be obvious.

If at any time you need inspiration or you're stuck on a certain part, do not hesitate to contact me or talk to other quilters that you know.

If you did not receive a piece of donut fabric, please let me know because I do not want you to miss out on this exciting and challenging experience.

I am looking forward to seeing how many accept this challenge. It is to be fun. It is something like "Where's Waldo" only it is "Where have all the donuts gone???"

The video links below will mostly use indigo dye. We are dyeing with Procion MX dye & will not be unwrap them immediately. Dale will take them all home and let them batch before I rinse them out. The reveal will take place at about 12:30 at our November Quilt Artists meeting.
